From the Rector

Dear Friends

REORGANISATION OF SERVICES IN THE MID LOES BENEFICE

As from September 2017, some of our churches will experience some changes in their monthly pattern of services. We need to make a reduction that amounts to slightly less than one service per Sunday (on average) across the benefice as a whole. I emphasise that this is a reduction across the benefice *as a whole*, and not each church, so it is a very minimal reduction, but will make staffing the services slightly more manageable.

We now have only one fully active priest on the ministry team regularly taking services, so one change is that we will be making use of the liturgical tradition that sometimes adds Holy Communion to Evening Prayer. This will enable me to conduct a Holy Communion service at every church in the benefice, morning or evening, every month. We will also be making greater use of 'fifth Sundays' to ease the pressure on the other Sundays. However, we will still need to make some use of clergy and lay ministers from outside the benefice, and at particularly busy periods we may have Lay Readers, Lay Elders, and occasionally Churchwardens leading a service of Communion-by-extension. The bishop of the diocese has authorised this to help multi-parish benefices like ours during major festivals, holiday periods, and when a minister is taken ill at short notice.

WHY NOW?

Really, this is a nettle which we should have grasped ten years ago when the old Earl Soham benefice joined up with the old Charsfield benefice. We went down from two incumbents to one but carried on as if nothing had changed, trying to maintain the same number of services. For one reason or another, which could not be helped, our benefice ministry team has reduced in size over the years and the existing pattern of services has become unsustainable.

THE FUTURE

This is not necessarily all bad news. More services does not necessarily mean more people, as some in our deanery are discovering. Indeed, one strand of thought in the current Deanery Plan is that "Some parishes may need to think about having less worship. One church in a neighbouring deanery has gone down to one service a month...and started to grow in numbers".

We don't currently intend to make that kind of reduction in this benefice, but we are a microcosm of the Church of England, and the future looks like this:

If you want to attend a 10am Holy Communion service *every* Sunday (and many do), you can do that in this benefice, including fifth Sundays. It won't always be in your particular parish church (it never has been) but there will be one in the benefice

Likewise, if you want to attend a Morning Prayer or an Evening Prayer (with or without Holy Communion) you will find one in the benefice most Sundays. Some will be Common Worship and some Book of Common Prayer. Similarly, if you want to attend an early morning Holy Communion service you will find one on three Sundays every month. If you prefer a Family Service, we have three of those on offer every month too.

If you don't mind what sort of service you attend, but you want to go to your local church, you will find something on most Sundays, and if there isn't a service there on a particular Sunday then there will be one at a neighbouring parish church.

ARE WE OFFERING LESS THAN OTHER BENEFICES?

No, we are offering more. For example, on every third Sunday in the month we will be offering seven services across the benefice. That is a greater number of services than I believe you will find in any other benefice in this deanery on any particular Sunday, and you would be hard-pressed to find another benefice in the diocese offering as much. Bear in mind also, that in terms of population, our benefice is half the size of Framlingham-with-Saxtead, or Wickham Market-with-Pettistree, yet we offer more services, with a smaller ministry team. I should add, of course, that we are not in competition with other benefices.

COPING WITH CHANGE

I know that change is always hard to adjust to, especially when we feel we are losing something, but I would urge everyone to use this opportunity to think positively about what their own pattern of worship might be and to make the most of what is on offer across the benefice - which is actually a great deal. There are many opportunities to worship God in whatever way you find most comfortable, and that is what matters most.

Communities share views to improve health and care services in Suffolk

We're Healthwatch. We listen to your views about local NHS and social care services so that we can make them better for everyone.

We have just launched our fourth annual report, which covers the year 2016/17. It tells you how we have been working and using people's experiences to shape, influence and improve local services throughout the year.

Five ways that health and care services have improved:

- 1. Maternity services increased support for birthing partners and changed policies so that birthing partners can stay with mum and baby overnight.
- 2. People will receive improved support and information to help them manage their risk of complications from foot disease caused by diabetes.
- 3. Residential and nursing homes have made changes that will improve the experience of some of Suffolk's most vulnerable people following visits by our volunteers.
- 4. We made safeguarding alerts that have led to immediate improvements to people's care.
- 5. We delivered patient feedback that helped to shape pathology services in Sudbury, including improvements to IT systems and access to appointments.

In our annual report, we highlight outcomes from our work that has included specific research projects, visits to local services and work across all levels of health and social care. Further examples include:

- Decisions to keep In Vitro Fertilisation (IVF) and Marginalised and Vulnerable Adults services were strongly influenced by public feedback we obtained in partnership with NHS leaders.
- Prompted by calls from young people for more information, we developed a new poster and information card that will help young people to find support.
- We worked closely with new GP partnerships to shape their plans for developing services by engaging patients within surgeries.
- We were central to the launch of a new Dementia Forum for Suffolk that will aim to change the way dementia support is provided in Suffolk. In addition, we have helped many people that contacted our free Information and Signposting Service to find support with their health and wellbeing needs.

Andy Yacoub (Chief Executive) said:

"People have a keen interest in their health and social care services and rightly so. Throughout the year, we have met many people; talking to them about their experiences and using them to influence decisions about our local services. We are proud of the impact we have made and, with increasing awareness of Healthwatch throughout the County, we know that our voice and influence can only increase with positive outcomes for patients, service users and carers throughout Suffolk."

A double gift from the Friends of St Mary's

Five years ago, the Friends asked Bishop and Sons to restore the organ in St Mary's, which was in decline. This spring we arranged a recital to celebrate the restoration. One balmy evening in July, at the invitation of the Friends, David Adams, organist of international fame, came to play the instrument to an audience of eighty, mostly from the village.

Through his programme Mr Adams demonstrated the diversity of sounds of which our instrument is capable. Before he began he 'warned' us that it was a small organ and thus limited, but as he played he showed us that its size belied its potential, now realised fully through sensitive restoration.

The programme included music from the 18th to the 20th Century. A particularly revealing contrast was that between the mellow warmth of Elgar's Vesper Voluntaries and the clear open texture of Van den Gheyn's Cuckoo Prelude for Carillon Bells. The sweet, very quiet high treble notes of the latter were heard clearly right at the back of the church. This was testament not only to the clarity of the stop but also to the fine acoustic of the building – something we perhaps take for granted.

Few of us had before been fully sensible of the instrument's versatility or of the range of repertoire it could encompass; both were revealed in David Adams' careful choice of music and through the thoughtful structure of his programme.

A great musician does not demonstrate his skill, he uses it to reveal the subtleties of the music and the qualities of the instrument he is playing. David Adams did just that. In the course of his recital we recognised our small organ for the delightful and special instrument it is.

Undoubtedly, the best part of my week is coming home to Suffolk on a Thursday evening and leaving behind all of the stresses and pressures of a week in Parliament, not to mention the congestion of London behind. Returning home to Suffolk makes me really appreciate all that is special about this county – its rural character, great sense of community spirit and vibrant market towns. Indeed only a few weeks ago, I was delighted to come together with my fellow Parliamentary colleagues from Suffolk to celebrate the first ever Suffolk Day. Here in Central Suffolk and North Ipswich, we are incredibly lucky to have a number of bustling market towns, all surrounded by rolling countryside and Suffolk's famous wide-open skies. Indeed, Suffolk's natural landscape has inspired writers, artists and musicians for centuries – Constable, Munnings and Britten to name a few, but of course more recently our own Ed Sheeran was inspired to write about Framlingham's "Castle on the Hill." With such a vibrant, growing economy, and outstanding transport links, it's no wonder that so many major businesses and small rural start-ups are choosing to make Suffolk their home. However I am becoming increasingly concerned about some of the inappropriately large planning applications that are being submitted to our local council planning committees.

One of the reasons that so many of us choose to live in Suffolk is because of its rural heritage and our beautiful countryside, and whilst we would all agree that we need an appropriate level of small scale development and affordable homes to help support young families to continue to live and work in Suffolk, none of us wants to see our countryside destroyed by inappropriate over-development. Planning is, of course, a local matter decided by our local councils and when deciding planning policy, where there should be new businesses and homes, it's important that our local councils take an evidence based approach, and always prioritise brownfield sites over building on the countryside. That is why it is so important for our local councils to make sure they have a local development framework and land supply plan in place, to discourage inappropriate development.

I will continue to work closely with our local councillors to ensure that we protect the rural nature and integrity of Suffolk's towns and villages and will always stand up for the best interests of local residents in fighting inappropriate planning applications.

Walnuts

A handful of walnuts may help reduce your feelings of hunger. Walnuts are unique among nuts in that they are mainly comprised of polyunsaturated fats, which help decrease ghrelin, a hormone that increases hunger. They also seem to increase peptide YY (PYY), a hormone that increases fullness or satiety.

As appetite hormones play an important part in regulating how much you eat, this could be good news. Whatever the science, a recent study published in the journal *Nutrition* suggests that walnuts "may favourably change appetite hormones so that we can feel fuller for longer."

Casting the Cretingham 'Peace Bell'

On 15th June, a group of Cretingham 'Peace Bell' supporters travelled to Loughborough to watch the casting of our sixth bell by Taylors - bell founders - which is now the only major bell foundry in the country. We watched as the molten metal was poured into the mould and one of the party wished that the bell would be rung only for peace. The whole process was carried out by dedicated craftsmen in a foundry with a Victorian feel to it. We did not see the bell itself as it takes a very long time for the metal to cool. Another bell was being cast beside ours. This was the eighth and last one for St George's Memorial Church, Ypres, Belgium. The Church was built between 1927-29 near to the Menin Gate. The tower at St George's was originally intended to house a peel of English change ringing bells although this was never realised. To commemorate the centenary of the end of the Great War, the money has been raised by a group in London to provide the bells as a lasting legacy of commemoration. Cretingham is planning a similar commemoration but with just one bell.

69th Annual Wickham Market Village Show 2017



This year's Village Show takes place on Saturday 5th and Sunday 6th August in Wickham Market Village Hall.

The show has grown substantially since the ones pre 1951 and we now have over 100 classes for a variety of ages and abilities. They create a magnificent display of colour and talent in the skills of vegetable growing, flower displays, photography, Cookery and Handicrafts.






