What is your vocation?

And of course it can change perhaps several times - throughout one's life and may even move from paid to voluntary employment, but is a vocation nevertheless. So what is, or has been, or will be yours? Sometimes it is more obvious to those around us than to ourselves!

CHARSFIELD SCHOOL

You may be aware that the only church school in our benefice is undergoing some significant changes as from the first of September. For several years now, Charsfield Church of England Voluntary Controlled Primary School has been in a partnership with Dennington CEVCP School, with a common head and governing body. For the past year those schools have had a temporary head in place, Mr Ian Page, who has led Charsfield through a successful Ofsted Inspection ('Good') and an

equally successful SIAMS (Church) Inspection - also graded 'Good'. But this month we will be welcoming a new permanent Executive Head - Dr Paul Parslow-Williams (who will be known as Mr Williams) - who will be taking on Charsfield and Dennington in addition to his existing headship at Occold Community Primary School. At the same time, all three schools will become academies and join the All Saints Schools Trust, a local Church-School based Multi Academy Trust (MAT) which already has five local primary schools. Exciting times indeed!

COMMUNITY SPEEDWATCH – WHAT WE DO AND WHY

Like many Suffolk villages, Charsfield residents are not alone in experiencing the detrimental impact of speeding vehicles travelling through our parish. Community Speed Watch (CSW) is one way in which we can help raise awareness of the 30mph speed limit in our village.

On the B1078, there are two sections of 30mph road through the village and they have been designated by Suffolk Highways due to known hazards such as driveways to homes, no pavements for pedestrians, no street lighting and, particularly in the summer months, hedges and other vegetation that limit visibility for all road users. Despite these risks and clear signage of the speed limit, Charsfield has an acute problem of speeding traffic with the most recent police data showing more than 50% of vehicles using the B1078 through the village travelling over 30mph. The problem is not just restricted to this road, as recorded speeds past the village school and along The Street show that some drivers are very much focused on their destination rather than concentrating on the drive to it.

A recent two-hour roadside CSW patrol in Charsfield on the B1078 recorded the following:

- 26 vehicles recorded travelling at or over 37 mph in a residential area with a 30mph speed limit
- Two vehicles recorded at over 50mph one of which was a staggering 60mph. A further two vehicles were recorded doing 49 mph.
- The average speed of reported vehicles was 42.5mph.

The mode (most common) speed was 40mph.

There are numerous ways in which excessive vehicle speed in residential areas of the village impacts our small community. Vulnerable road users such as children, dog walkers, horse riders, pedestrians and cyclists as well as those entering and exiting the driveways of their properties by car, face significant risk of personal injury. In addition, noise and environmental pollution is increased. In most cases, drivers who speed do so unthinkingly. They make the same journey, twice a day, five days per week and come to know their route 'like the back of their hand' and exactly how long it takes to get from their own driveway to their destination nearly to the minute. Signage, road markings warning of hazards and speed limit signs can easily blend into the mental background for even the most experienced driver. In addition, drivers of modern vehicles are better insulated from the external environment. With reduced engine or road noise in the driver compartment and safety features such as ABS, traction control and driving lights, it is easy to be travelling much in excess of the stated speed limit as audible feedback to the driver of speed is much reduced in a modern car today than it was just five years ago. This is one way in which driving at excessive speed can become routine and feel 'normal'.

The primary purpose of Community Speed Watch is to inform and educate drivers as to the speed limit in residential areas. In many cases, the presence of the CSW patrol by the roadside does this very effectively and drivers slow down. For those drivers travelling over the speed limit, the CSW patrol has a simple radar device (issued and calibrated by the Police) that measures vehicle speed. Details of vehicles identified as travelling over the stated speed limit are noted, collated and sent to Suffolk Constabulary. No information passed to the police in this manner can result in direct enforcement action.

From this information provided by CSW, the police have a number of options as to any action they decide to take. They may elect to write a warning letter to the registered keeper of the vehicle, visit a home address to speak to the driver directly or take no action at all. They certainly will not and cannot fine or prosecute based on CSW data.

Because of the known significant speeding problem in the parish along the B1078, the Norfolk and Suffolk Safety Camera team do deploy in Charsfield. It is possible that any driver of a vehicle detected by this team as travelling in excess of the speed limit may be prosecuted.

A group of local residents voluntarily give up their personal time to carry out CSW patrols to help raise awareness and educate drivers of the speed limit in the village and support local police road safety initiatives. If you would be interested in taking a more active part in helping reduce the risk of accidents along our village roads we would be very pleased to have you on board. Ashfield Parish Council has received requests from some members of the electorate to acquire items for the benefit of the village and its residents, as follows:-

Defibrillator to be mounted on a wall of the village hall (estimated cost about £1,500)

Vehicle speed display (estimated cost about £3,500)

Bin for dog faeces (estimated cost about £150)

The PC is happy to undertake these purchases if that is the wish of the electorate; however, the necessary funding would need to be found. In principle, the PC would seek grants where such are available, but it is very likely that some , if not all, of the cost would have to be found via a short-term increased precept.

[The precept is a proportion of everyone's council tax bill allocated by Mid-Suffolk District Council to the PC, and ultimately comes from all council tax payers – currently about $\pounds 30 - \pounds 50$ per annum for households in our village – and is administered by the Parish Council]

These purchases will affect everyone in the village, not only in the usefulness of the facility provided, but also in the cost of their council tax bill. All residents are therefore warmly invited to attend.




