SPEED INDICATOR for CRETINGHAM – one of the matters for discussion and decision at the next Parish Council meeting will be the installation of a Speed Indicator Device (SID) in Cretingham.

A proposal is prepared which, subject to the meeting's decision, will be submitted to Suffolk CC Highways. In brief – four sites are proposed for the sign, two of them bi-directional. The battery-operated sign will shuttle between these locations on a programme to be agreed with the volunteer team. The sign flashes the vehicle's speed as well as a "smiley" or "fierce" face. It also records the time and speed of every vehicle that passes (but not the number-plate).

The Parish Council meetings are open to residents of the three villages and you are welcome to attend to express your views on this, or other agenda matters. The agenda will be posted 7 days prior to the meeting on our website: http://cretinghammonewdenhoo.onesuffolk.net/
