At the time of writing I am pleased to be able to report that at long last work is taking place to repair the footbridge over the River Deben along Cretingham Lane. The bridge has been closed for a long time now and has prevented walkers from Ashfield getting to paths in Framsden and viceversa. Hopefully the bridge will reopen very soon.

Whilst the wet weather doesn't lend itself to walking crossfield paths at present as far as I am aware all routes are open and passable at the present time.

If you do encounter any obstruction or other issue with any path in Ashfield please let Malcolm Pease or myself [email address at the front of this mag] know straight away so that remedial action can if required be taken to put things right. Thanks.

HIGHWAY [ROADS] MATTERS.

As you may be aware already Suffolk County Council are trying to set up a self help scheme to cover low level highways issues in parishes. This effectively covers many of the tasks that I am already dealing with, drainage, sign cleaning etc and when required reporting potholes or other items requiring professional attention. In due course, hopefully it will be possible to help residents with overgrown hedges obstructing traffic or posing difficulties for accessing or egressing their properties. Quite often simply trimming back a hedge or removing a few inches from the top can greatly improve your visibility and road safety at the same time! In extreme cases SCC as the Highway's Authority can issue a 'Hedge Cutting Notice', hopefully there will be no need for these in Ashfield! Please get in touch with me if you think I can help you improve road safety near your property.

The Leaking roof

Our thanks to everyone that have supported the Concerts and Mardle events organised by Letheringham St Mary's PCC over recent years. The money raised from these events supplemented by a £8,700 Government "Stitch in time grant," has enabled us to replace 90% of the North side of our Nave roof. The work undertaken should stop the leaking roof and prevent further damage to the church's ancient fabric.

A special thanks to Rob Pearce and Tim Buxbaum for their invaluable support in helping us obtain the grant and to all the volunteers and performers that have help us with the Mardles and Concerts, without their help the £23,000 total bill for this work could never have been met.

There is much more restoration work to be done and these works are vital to ensure that this ancient place of worship is there for future generations.

CRETINGHAM TOWNLANDS TRUST

An air of mystery surrounds the Cretingham Townlands Trust, perhaps because, of the five village organisations, it is the one which does not appear to DO anything; no socials, no public AGMs. Perhaps, also, because the Trust is thought to own something, but no one is quite sure what.

The Trust is one of many hundreds throughout the country which date back to the mid-sixteenth century when, following the dissolution of the monasteries, care for the poor fell on the parishes, a burden which they were generally not over keen to take on. In the past the religious institutions had looked after the sick, poor and needy as part of their religious duty and many religious houses were given money to do so by wealthy benefactors hoping to ease their own path into the afterlife.

With a more secular age it fell upon the community to take care of its own and so those with wealth to spare and position to uphold took on the responsibility and looked for ways in which to settle monies in perpetuity for poor relief and the benefit of clergy and church buildings.

These public-spirited citizens settled land, buildings and money for the purpose. In many cases these tiny charitable institutions were all but forgotten as the centuries passed and often it was not until the middle of the twentieth century that communities became aware of the funds and wondered what to do with them.

So it was in Cretingham. The Townlands Trust was set up by Arthur Penning and William Barwick in 1561, early in the reign of Elizabeth 1, to keep the church in good repair and for the general benefit of the parishioners, the poor and the needy. In 1819 the then vicar, the Rev Joseph Jefferson added two acres of his own land to augment the glebe lands to be let at ten shillings a year for the benefit of the poor. By 1826 the Trust owned some land, the blacksmith's shop, where now Dial House garages stand, a cottage for the blacksmith, the public house, now Dial House, and three other cottages for the poor of the parish.

You might think that such a respectable body would carry on its business in a quiet and decorous manner, but in the 1930s following a major row, about what nobody who was in the village at the time has ever been prepared to explain, it was stipulated that the local constable should attend all meetings "in case of fisticuffs".

When Michael and Pamela Pinner moved to Cretingham, into what had been The Bell, but was now all but derelict, Michael began to research the Trust and with the help of a local solicitor, Nigel Bonham-Carter resurrected the Trust and after much correspondence with the Charity Commission established that 40% of the available income should be paid to the Church for maintenance of the building and the rest paid out for the benefit of any local people who may need some small help towards their fuel costs.

Over the years much of the property has been sold off, but there remain one building, the old post office, currently let as a workshop, a small parcel of amenity land and some seven acres let as farmland. The residual income from these holdings continues to be distributed to help towards living costs for anyone in the village who may need the help. There is also a small fund which can be used to help out in exceptional circumstances.

Of the trustees, two are appointed by the Parochial Church Council, two by the Cretingham, Monewden and Hoo Parish Council and the remaining two are co-opted from residents in the parish. The current chair is Gerry Field.

Today meetings are held twice-yearly, so far without further violent incident! Antonia Field.
