DEANERY TAIZÉ SERVICES via YouTube

Last year, as part of the Diocesan-wide *Growing in God* initiative, clergy from our Deanery (Loes) organised a series of monthly Sunday afternoon services based around the Taizé tradition. These services used meditative chants, prayer, silence and scripture around a variety of specific themes. The Rev'd Canon Graham Hedger, from our neighbouring Orebeck Benefice, hosted the services in Easton and the service-format was compiled by Rev'd Wendy Gourlay. A good number of people attended and the plan was to continue the initiative in 2020.

The COVID-19 lockdown jeopardised those plans until technology was harnessed to make a new series of services available via YouTube. The format remains the same but the individual elements - bible reading, prayers, a meditation, an interlude for silent reflection and live music to accompany the chants - were pre-recorded and then edited together into a service lasting around 30 minutes. Each service is "stand-alone", and each has a different focus. We are grateful for the dozen-plus contributors who have made the services so personal and individual.

The final service of 2020 will be available from the 15th of November and can be accessed via the St Peter's, Cretingham page of our Benefice website: www.mid-loes.com/cretingham.php This location also gives you access to all of the 2020 services from June onwards. A printable order of service is also available on the same webpage but the words for chants, prayers, etc do appear on-screen.

To date the services have been viewed over 350 times and it is hoped that a new series will be available in 2021 - especially if the pandemic is still reducing our opportunity to meet safely in larger groups.

You do not have to be a subscriber to YouTube to watch these services. They are loaded to a private channel within the site and only accessible via the channel code accessed via the Benefice website i.e. you cannot search for them via Google.

Current News from Charsfield C of E Primary School

Everyone has settled back into school life here at Charsfield and it feels like we've never been away! There is a lovely atmosphere in our school, as the children are working hard and having fun with their learning at the same time! The staff and I have been determined to keep things as "normal" as we possibly can and give our children plenty of exciting learning experiences. Feedback from parents has been very encouraging and positive, and I am pleased that our children have adapted so well to the changes we have made to our school day.

Our Reception, Year 1 and 2 pupils are learning about castles and they hope to be able to visit a local castle very soon. They had fun dressing up as kings, queens and knights to act out a scene in our beautiful school grounds. In Year 3 and 4, pupils are learning about the Anglo-Saxons and Vikings and they are going to visit West Stow Anglo-Saxon village in early October to find out more about life in an Anglo-Saxon village. Our pupils in Year 5 and 6 are learning all about World War 2 and how it started. They are going to be learning about life as an evacuee using the story Goodnight Mr Tom to help bring it to life. We hope that the weather will be kind enough for us to be able to recreate an "evacuee walk" around the village, complete with evacuee costumes, to help the children imagine what the children would have gone though all those years ago.

On Fridays we are having Forest School lessons where the children learn new skills and become confident in the outdoor environment. All pupils take part in these sessions within their Covid-secure bubbles. We are lucky enough to be able to hold these sessions on our school site as the area is suitable with lots of trees and wooded areas, and we have a member of staff who is Forest School trained. Every day, pupils are taking part in the daily mile run, and we are hoping that this will put them in good stead for our whole school Cross Country run. We will be holding this on the village recreation ground to enable all pupils to remain socially distant and within their bubbles. We will use this as our virtual entry for the Suffolk Small Schools Games Competitions that we take part in throughout the year. Fingers crossed for a dry day!

We are holding open mornings on Thursday 22nd October and Tuesday 10th November for anyone who is looking for schooling in the area and would like to see our fantastic school in action (parents of all year groups are welcome). However, to meet current guidelines and to keep everyone safe, we are only admitting people with an appointment (these are limited to ensure we don't have too many people on site) and visitors will be required to wear a mask and sanitise their hands regularly. Church repairs

Repair work has started on the church. This phase of the work is largely routine maintenance, including replacing stonework and masonry on three windows and some releading, re-pointing and plaster work, and securing loose stones on the top of the tower.

The church remains open for services and private prayer on Sundays and Wednesdays while the work is in progress.

Cretingham, Monewden and Hoo Parish Council.

Parish Council meetings are taking place virtually at present via Zoom. The dates of meetings are published on our website where, a week or so before the meeting, you will also find the Zoom link if you wish to join the meeting. There is always an agenda item allowing members of the public to raise issues and it is helpful if the Clerk can be given some advance notice of these so that any necessary information can be gathered in order to provide the most useful response.

During the current pandemic Councillors have been kept up-to-date via regular bulletins from: Framlingham Town Council, East Suffolk District Council and Suffolk County Council. These reports can be accessed via the relevant websites.

One "live issue" during the late summer was the increased, but necessary, farm traffic on our narrow country roads - coupled with an increase in the number of cyclists and pedestrians. Your council wrote to five farmers/contractors who work locally outlining its concerns and received positive and accommodating replies.

Another road safety issue is excessive speed by all types of road users (yes, cyclists - you know who I mean!). The installation of the proposed Speed Indicator Device in Cretingham has been delayed by the furlough of Suffolk Highways staff but is now just waiting for the final health and safety protocols to be agreed. We hope it will be installed before Christmas
