
#### Earl Soham 100 Club

## **News from Charsfield Primary School**

We've had a great start back to school with lots of exciting learning taking place. At the start of term, we were delighted to welcome our new Reception pupils to the school, who have settled in so well into school life that it feels like they've been at Charsfield forever!



In Class 2, our year 3 and 4 pupils have been learning about the Romans and were incredibly lucky to be treated to a museum day in school where they were able to handle genuine Roman artefacts and learn more about them. The pupils then visited Colchester Castle to learn more about the Roman's and the impact they had on the local area. In our science lessons we have been learning about our amazing bodies with a focus on bones and skeletons!

Our oldest pupils in Class 3 are learning about life in Victorian Britain and will be travelling back in time to experience life in the workhouse at Gressenhall in Norfolk. We will also be finding out where our resources come from and how we can make choices to help reduce the impact on the environment. In science we have been learning about light and how our eyes are so amazing that they help us to see everything in colour. Next, we will be finding out all about electricity and having fun with circuits!

Celebrations is the topic for our youngest pupils in the school, and they have been learning about different types of celebrations that we might experience in our lives and what it's like to be a part of that celebration. In PE pupils have been learning about the skills required to work together as a team in games. All Key Stage 2 pupils took part in the Suffolk Schools Cross Country Competition and out of just 22 pupils we managed to achieve gaining two 2nd places, a 3rd and a 4th place. These pupils will now go forward to the county finals.

In art all the pupils have been learning about printing. Our younger pupils have created positive and negative prints using polystyrene tiles and string. Pupils in key stage 2 have been learning about mosaics and have used printing sticks to create their own mosaic prints.

We are incredibly lucky to live in a rural county like Suffolk, largely protected from overdevelopment, but one of the biggest issues that people ask me about is the planning system.

Whilst we all accept that we need to build more homes for local people and for our children and grandchildren, it is essential that any new homes are built in the right place and with the right infrastructure.

It is for these reasons that I helped to lead the successful campaign to stop the Ipswich Northern Bypass. Right from the start, it always seemed to me that the bypass was more about mass house building than about relieving any travel and congestion issues in Ipswich, and that is why so many people, like me, fought against it.

Any new housing should, in general, be on a small scale and incremental. The planning system needs to protect our precious countryside wherever possible and retain the fabric, character and heritage of our villages and towns. I have made it clear to Government ministers that any decisions around new homes and where they should be located, is a matter which must be decided locally, in full consultation with residents, parish and local councils. New homes should be delivered through a locally led planning system. Communities should retain the right to shape the areas in which they live and to be able to demand health and educational infrastructure to support any new housing.

So, I am pleased to report that working alongside a number of other MPs, I have succeeded in delivering a rethink on the recent Government Planning White Paper. The White Paper would have set national targets for house building, made it much easier for developers to build houses and would have circumvented the local planning process. For me, this would have been wrong. It is essential that planning rules are set locally, not according to national targets, and I am pleased to have played my part in ensuring that this will continue to be the case.

Later this year, the Government will firmly set out new planning laws in its Planning Bill and I am confident that these laws will deliver a planning system that is locally led and fit for the future. With COP26 upon us, it is essential that due consideration is also given to the environment and I would also like to see a planning system that delivers high quality, low carbon design, helping to ensure cost effective, energy efficient homes, so that we continue to play our world-leading role in tackling climate change.

## **Maintenance Day**

On Friday 29<sup>th</sup> October the members of the Dallinghoo Church Repair Fund Committee met in St Mary's Church to carry out our scheduled annual autumn maintenance. This began with a general check that all was well. We went on to inspect roofs, check that rain water gutters, gullies and inspection chambers were clear, check internal plumbing, check trees and bushes did not need pruning and trimmed around the building and the gravestones.

Quiet conversations and the clinking of cups of coffee were interspersed by the buzz of a strimmer. The quantity and quality of mud dug out of some inspection chambers would gladden the heart of any horticulturalist. Several of the chamber cover slabs are cast on rusty corrugated iron and have been ear-marked for replacement.

Chris Pennington's trailer was filled, carted to the bonfire site in the Playing Field and refilled. But there is still plenty more gardening to do.
