On  $2^{nd}$  February we celebrate Candlemas Day, this ancient festival marks the midpoint of winter, halfway between the shortest day and the spring equinox. A time to celebrate the increase in strength of the life – giving sun as winter gives way to spring.

Candlemas can mean different things to different people. Candlemas is a traditional Christian festival that commemorates the ritual purification of Mary, forty days after the birth of Jesus and the presentation of baby Jesus to God at the Temple at Jerusalem. ## CHARSFIELD PRIMARY SCHOOL SPREAD A LITTLE HAPPINESS THIS CHRISTMAS

In this unprecedented time, pupils at Charsfield Primary School have been looking at how they can make a difference in the community and improve mental health and wellbeing of themselves and others around them. For a small school of just 38 pupils, they have made an incredible difference to the lives of many others this term. Here are just a few of the things that the school has been involved in. The school was delighted to be able to support the Lighthouse Women's Aid in Ipswich with their reverse advent calendar appeal. Pupils and their families generously donated gifts and essentials throughout the beginning of Advent, to help families that are less fortunate than themselves through a particularly challenging time in their lives. Debbie, the Fundraising and Training Administrator from Lighthouse Women's Aid, ran a virtual assembly for the children to explain how their thoughtfulness will help.

Secondly, as part of the 'Suffolk Says Thanks' campaign, the school has furthered their links with Handford House Nursing Home set up during the summer lockdown. The pupils had discussed the campaign, 'Cards for Kindness', an initiative which aims to reduce loneliness in our care homes by encouraging members of the community to send a card to a local care home. The Handford House residents had kindly sent the pupils a handmade Christmas card and the children reciprocated with great enthusiasm creating a wonderful collection of Christmas drawings made into a large book full of festive wishes. Mrs Foster, who is a Teaching Assistant at the school and the lead for Mental Health and Wellbeing,



said "The staff are so proud of how the children have thrown themselves into this task, and how much they thought they gave about the people it was going to; with a genuine desire to bring happiness to other people that they don't even know. We look forward to continuing links with this nursing home in 2021."

The school has been delighted to be able to raise lots of money for various charities this half term, particularly

when so many people have found this year financially challenging. Pupils and staff dressed up in spots and stripes for Children in Need, designed and sold their own Christmas cards to raise money for the Salvation Army and finally donned their festive jumpers for the Save the Children's Christmas Jumper Day on December 11<sup>th</sup>. In total, the school raised £150 for these charities.

In true "the show must go on spirit," the PTA stepped in to fund a virtual showing of Cinderella for the pupils as they were not able to attend the Wolsey Theatre Panto. This was made all the more special by the staff surprising them by dressing up as characters from the story, and then being ushers showing them to their seats and issuing them with popcorn. Even Father Christmas upped his game this year to reward the pupils and 'went virtual' and sent the pupils an incredibly special video message and a small gift each.

Head of School, Mrs Amie Reeve said, "Charsfield Primary School have certainly shown that a bit of thought and kindness can make such a difference to so many people lives, in what will certainly be a Christmas to remember for a very long time to come." Sadly, for the start of the Spring Term the school has had to move to online learning for the majority of our pupils using Google Classrooms. Teachers are running daily online lessons with pupils, as well as setting independent tasks across all the subjects (not just maths and English!). Feedback from parents and pupils has been really positive and many of our children were disappointed not to be able to return to the classroom because of the 3rd na-

tional lockdown. We hope to see our pupils return to "normal" learning very soon.

## **SUSPENSION OF SCHEDULED CHURCH SERVICES.**

Just after New Year the UK went back into lockdown because of the worsening Covid19 situation. Whilst the holding of church services is still permitted under the latest rules we have taken the decision to suspend collective worship for the time being at St Mary's and across the benefice. The personal wellbeing of our congregation and wider populace must take precedence.

During this latest period of lockdown our Ministry Team is putting together some resources weekly for people to use at home. If you would like to be in receipt of this ministry resource please let myself or Jane Davidson know and we can forward it to you in time for the upcoming Sunday.

## **QUINQUENNIAL INSPECTION.**

Every five years there is a requirement to have the church building inspected by a professional architect. This process is known as a quinquennial inspection [QI]. St Mary's had its most recent QI just before Christmas. Whilst I am relieved that the inspection didn't reveal anything too major there will be some works to be undertaken in the foreseeable future. Once I have had a chance to look at the requirements and discussed with the PCC I shall let everyone know what is happening and the likely funding we will need to raise to accomplish this. RG.

# 02 January 2021

At the time of my writing, the Prime Minister has addressed the nation once more and we find ourselves living under further restrictions, with the current advice being to stay at home to stop the spread of coronavirus.

Whilst there is no doubt that in fighting the old variant of the virus, our collective efforts were working, but we now face the added challenge of the new strain of the virus, which is between 50% and 70% more transmissible. This new strain has led to a rapid surge in infections, hospital admissions and increased case rates across the country, including here in Suffolk.

If we are to protect our NHS and in turn, ourselves and our loved ones, we must all play our part and follow the guidance so that our NHS can focus on the herculean task of delivering the critical vaccination programme. It is the vaccination that will finally free us from this virus and the restrictions it brings to all our daily lives

Vaccinations have already begun here in Suffolk and I have been lobbying Ministers and Public Health colleagues to ensure that we have adequate site provision here in Central Suffolk and North Ipswich. Our public health team and NHS colleagues here in Suffolk are working tirelessly to deliver the vaccines as quickly and efficiently as possible, to those most in need and I would echo their plea to ask residents not to block phone lines to GP surgeries or hospitals enquiring about when the vaccine might be available – residents will be contacted directly, in turn, and invited to attend their nearest site for vaccination.

Whilst I and indeed, our Prime Minister, understand just how frustrating this latest lockdown is, it is vital that we all continue to take the necessary precautions to protect ourselves and those most vulnerable in our communities and to slow the spread of the virus. Again, I would like to thank each and every one of you who are continuing to play your part and following the rules – we're all in this together and the sooner we stick with it, the sooner we can start to return to normal.

It is vital that throughout lockdown, we continue to protect jobs and our local economy, and the Chancellor has unveiled further financial support for businesses and individuals. Locally, the **Suffolk Support and Advice Line** can help with financial and employment advice - **0800 068 3131**. In addition, the **Home But Not Alone** free phoneline, supporting the most vulnerable in our communities is available via **0800 876 6926**. Both lines are staffed from 9am to 5pm Monday to Friday.

### **CRETINGHAM, MONEWDEN & HOO PARISH COUNCIL**

Update: January 2021. Your Councillors met in the middle of January (by Zoom) and this report updates you on what was discussed.

Being the first meeting of the year there were a half-dozen or so statutory documents to approve around Standing Orders, Asset Registers, etc. We then moved to the main business - setting the Parish Precept - i.e. the sum that is added to your Council Tax bill in April to support the work at parish level. I am sure you will be pleased to hear that we voted unanimously for a standstill budget which means NO INCREASE in the Parish element of Council Tax in 2021-22.

Reports were given to our meeting by your County Councillor, Nick Gowrley, and your District Councillor, Maurice Cook. Both reports highlighted the work of our District and County Councils in supporting local businesses during the past and current lockdowns.

The project to install a Speed Indicator Device (SID) at a number of alternative sites in Cretingham was discussed and we noted that the SCC Highways Dept. are currently finalising Health and Safety issues around the installation/re-alignment of the poles required. The same department is also to quote us for the replacement/refurbishment of the finger-post signs at junctions across the three parishes - although whether we will be able to service every sign is very much dependent on finances. We are using our £7,277 Community Infrastructure Fund windfall to finance both the SID and these replacement signs.

Councillors also discussed the signing and way marks for public footpaths - a real boon in these lockdown conditions. Generally, they were felt to be in good order and they do ensure that walkers keep to the recognised paths and don't stray over farmland. However, if you know of missing signs/waymarks. Please let your local Councillor know. We also discussed the permitted use of Monewden Airfield and other planning matters.
