

On 28th March we celebrate Palm Sunday which represents the end of Lent and the beginning of Holy Week. The forty days of Lent represent the days fasting, spent in the wilderness, it is a time when we often give something up or more positively take something on.

Palm Sunday is celebrated by the blessing and distribution of palm branches or palm crosses, representing the palm branches which the crowds scattered in front of Christ as he rode into Jerusalem. In this Benefice we have often had a donkey led procession to church, the donkey is traditionally an animal of peace unlike the horse which is an animal of war. Jesus was coming to conquer but with love and not with force.

Palm consecration is at the centre of the Christian custom on Palm Sunday and churches can be decorated with green branches, not with palm in our cooler climate but with pussy willow, boxwood, juniper, holly and yew. Green is the dominant colour in decoration, it also symbolizes the new beginning in life.

Other places have different traditions for Palm Sunday. In Finland children dress up as "Easter Witches" and go door to door in their neighbourhood and trade pussy willow branches for treats saying "I'm wishing you a fresh healthy year, a branch for you and a prize for me. One of the more bizarre traditions of 15th to 17th century England was that Palm Sunday was marked by the burning of "Jack-o-Lent" figures. This was a straw effigy which would be stoned on Ash Wednesday, and kept in the parish to be burned on Palm Sunday. Thought to represent a kind of revenge on Judas Iscariot, also the hated figure of winter, whose destruction prepares the way for Spring. Another worldwide tradition for Palm Sunday is the purchase of new clothes, particularly for children.

This year we are hoping to celebrate the joy of Palm Sunday together at Ashfield, either inside the church or outside in the churchyard. Please come and join us, all welcome, socially distanced of course.

Graham Vellacott 18th May 1937 - 21st January 2021

Graham was born in Chelmsford, ten years older than his sister and 14 years older than his brother. He grew up on a farm at Rainham and went away to boarding school. It was war time and he once told me that the reason he didn't eat potatoes was that they were grey and lumpy at school! After school he did a degree in agriculture at a college in Devon.

After agricultural college Graham worked for a big chicken company as farm manager for ten years and after that for a company selling agricultural equipment as their manager in Norway and Sweden.

He met Mary when, in her college holidays, she went to look after the younger children in the family. Graham knew immediately that Mary was the one he would marry. They were married when they were 24 and lived in Kettleburgh. Mary taught at Brandeston Hall school. They adopted three children: Heather, Chris and Titch (who were all baptised in Easton). In 1967 they moved to Soham House where they lived for fifty years.

Later in his career Graham applied to train for the priesthood and was ordained in 1994. He was curate in Framlingham, then becoming Priest in Charge at Easton. Kettleburgh and Brandeston were eventually added to his benefice.

As a priest Graham was very pastorally aware and knew nearly everyone in his parishes. He enjoyed a pint in the pub and got to know many local people that way. He enjoyed celebrating farming and rural life in church services such as Harvest and Rogation, his knowledge of agricultural life coming to the fore. He also loved family occasions, especially baptism services when he would involve all the children there. Weddings were also joyful occasions.

The cover of his funeral service sheet had a photo of Graham with one of his donkeys, which he loved so much. At the service the memories of Graham included dog walks - preferably beginning and ending at a pub - and his love of football to which he would take Heather, borrowing a milk crate for her to stand on. Other memories included his postcards which would be sent from holidays and on other occasions, but which were often indecipherable so that it became a joint effort by recipients to read them.

Graham was known for his calm and gentle encouragement of people in their faith journey. He was seldom angry and did not say bad things about anyone, although he would criticise unkindness. He had an empathy with those in need and supported others in their ministry. Graham's faith was strong and unwavering. He had a good life and we have shared something special in knowing him. JWE

HOO NOTES

Here are some observations by Judy Raymont, who sought shelter in the porch of Hoo church. This was sent to me (Kathleen) and I thought it would be good to share it with you all

Porch in a storm

The porch door is open. I am grateful to step inside out of the biting wind. There is a bench seat — a perfect place to have my sandwich and coffee. The door swings alarmingly. Outside on the wall there is a hook to keep it open and although it is cold, I would rather this than be in the dark.

For a while I sit looking out at the gravestones but then turn inwards to observe my surroundings. At first there is a dismal sense of ending, echoing the graves outside. There is a Covid notice pinned to the locked church door, the half hidden notice on the bench in large red writing 'CAN'. I know what it is going to say – cancelled. That was the carol service.

How sad it all is. But looking more closely, there are signs of life: The two watering cans on the floor that hint of flowers to be arranged once more and graves to be tended. The almost empty cleaning rota, abruptly halted by the pandemic, has an old photo pinned beneath it of a happy band of ladies with brooms, dustpan and brush, cloths and aprons—cleaning will resume!

There are piles of conkers – now dusty and wrinkled - nestling on the shelf above the bench, collected by the Sunday school children? And a useful supply of drawing pins in an old Cremolia jar. There will be more notices, just give it time.

I read with interest the information about St Andrew and St Eustachius. The former I know about but the latter is a new find. I am glad to learn his story. What a man! What commitment to The Lord! What an inspiration!

There are two pretty earthenware jugs and a notice about donations for the harvest appeal, only a few months ago but it seems a whole lifetime away. The church year is put on hold, its life suspended, holding its breath, waiting.

I pick up a spare copy of the parish magazine and read of communities living and working together through it all, supporting one another, keeping faith.

I am sorry I have no money to contribute – does anyone carry cash anymore? But I offer this, my contribution and my thanks for your welcoming porch.

On my way out I notice there is a light switch with a quaintly written instruction. I have no need of it now I am leaving. But good to know for another time.

I unhook and close the door and then notice, unbelievably, a tiny cowslip amongst the gravestones, bravely flowering this early in the year, surely a sign of new life and hope. $\label{eq:signal} 8$



Having been contacted by a number of parents and schools concerned about the disparity of higher needs education funding here in Suffolk compared to our neighbouring counties, I have urged the Education Secretary to urgently review Suffolk's funding allocation and to level up education funding for our children and young people.

I share the concerns of parents and schools and I am growing increasingly concerned that without a meaningful injection of cash, many of Suffolk's children risk losing out on their fair share. We already know that Suffolk is facing a substantial increase in the number of children and young people in need of additional support, yet rates for special school places in the county are significantly below those of our neighbours.

Suffolk children and Suffolk schools deserve better and at the very least, a level playing field. The current funding allocation is not right and nor is it fair and this is why I have written to the Secretary of State setting out the case for Suffolk and requesting that his Department levels up Suffolk's SEND funding to secure a fairer future for our brilliant children and young people.

Although our schools currently remain closed under the current restrictions, I have been heartened to hear of the innovative examples of home learning, both from parents and our teachers. That said, home learning cannot take the place of being in class for face to face teaching and I remain hopeful that our schools can begin to return in early March.

Ahead of our schools returning, the Government continues to make great progress with the vaccination programme and I am continuing to press the case with the Vaccination Minister and local health leaders to make sure that Suffolk residents are invited to receive their vaccine just as soon as is practicably possible.

As more and more of us receive the vaccine, light is very definitely at the end of the tunnel with many millions of people having being vaccinated across the country. This is a fantastic achievement and my thanks go to all who have been involved in co-ordinating the herculean effort of rolling out the vaccination programme.

We still have some way to go and cannot rest on our laurels, so it remains vital that we all continue to play our part in helping to stop the spread of COVID. We mustn't drop our guard now when we have come so far and the end goal is in sight. The single most important action we can all take is to follow the guidance to stay at home, protect the NHS and save lives.

DALLINGHOO NOTES

St Mary's Dallinghoo Repair Programme Update

Our major repair programme is now well underway with scaffolding up all around the church. Huge thanks to many of you who have contributed to our fund raising so far. We are still short of our overall target and so we'd love it if you went to our JustGiving site and searched on Dallinghoo to make a donation.



Our challenge is to make the building watertight and to then repair all the wear and tear. Many of you will know that St Mary's is very unusual as the tower is at the east end! This is because the chancel was inadvertently demolished when the tower, overloaded with bells, collapsed onto it in the 1700's. Some of our repairs are to correct the rebuilding work they

did then!

Repairing repairs from the 19th century!

One such issue is with the south east buttress which is collapsing away from the tower. We have discovered that when the church was repaired after the tower collapsed in the 1700's the builders seem to have cut some corners. The rebuild work was then privately funded and the budget seems to have been tight as many of the new stones they installed have been cut in half. They look correct from the outside but once you rake them out they don't extend into the wall far enough to provide the strength needed. We are installing new stones of the correct size.

The squirrels are eating our lead!

One advantage of having scaffolding all around the church is that you can take a close look at the parts you'd never normally see. One thing that caught our eye was at the very top of the roof where it seems the squirrels have been sharpening their teeth on our lead and bitten right through.

The turret staircase is peeling away from the tower

The top of our spiral tower staircase came off when the tower collapsed. But the builders then fixed them back to the tower with a large iron bar through the wall. This has now rusted away and the stone stair turret is trying to peel away leaving an impressive crack that we need to fill. Don't worry, we're assured that we've caught it in time and it isn't going to fall down.

ASHFIELD FOOTPATHS.

Despite all the exceptionally wet weather recently and of late the heavy snow I know and am encouraged to see the footpath network in Ashfield and further afield being well used during the current lock down. Whilst very few of our routes cross fields that host livestock I would respectfully ask that if you are in that situation you keep any dogs on a short lead particularly in the vicinity of sheep as we go into the spring lambing season. There have been some quite horrific dog attacks on sheep both in Suffolk and elsewhere in the country recently, something I hope will not be repeated around here! If you are in fields with cattle and you and your pet are pursued by a cow or bull LET GO of the lead, stay calm and quietly call your dog back once the situation has calmed down. As far as I am aware all routes in Ashfield are accessible at the moment however crossfield routes are and will remain muddy for a little while yet. If you are walking close to the edges of fast moving water, the Rivers Ken or Deben for example, the banks may well be slippery, be careful not to fall in as the currents are very strong! Please report any problems/concerns to myself and I will try to address them.
