Hospitality... more than just food and drink. Six weeks have now passed since my installation as Priest-in-Charge within the Mid-Loes Benefice and already I am feeling at home, right across the eight parishes in which I serve.

I thought it only right that I should say 'thank you' on behalf of all those that travelled from my previous parish, who have all said how warmly welcomed they were and thoroughly enjoyed meeting everyone who made the evening so special. The whole evening reminded me of the importance of welcoming others into our lives and how hospitality should form such an important part of our lives.

Since my installation, we have also celebrated our Queen's Platinum Jubilee, which was a wonderful occasion for all the villages, where again, the level of hospitality was wonderful, especially witnessing people of all ages, family, friends and neighbours, celebrating together... and mainly in the sunshine!

It is easy to suggest that hospitality is just about food and drink, but it goes far beyond this. The Collins English Dictionary defines hospitality as, 'kindness in welcoming strangers or guests', which suggests more than just providing food and drink... it is about the friendly and generous reception and entertainment of guests, visitors, or strangers. The hospitality that I have received during the past weeks has been wonderful, a real welcome of the 'stranger', which has been expressed across all the parishes.

Hospitality benefits both the guest and the host, and it is the process of hospitality that creates change in both the host and the guest, as it is mutually beneficial and covers spiritual and emotional needs as well as practical. It is in the welcome of hospitality that friendships can start to develop and the stranger start to flourish. Listening attentively and being fully present to another is indeed one of the highest forms of hospitality.

Friendships forged in hospitality contradict contemporary messages about who is valuable, good to be with and can give life to others. Hospitality is an antidote to loneliness, and helps form community, where all are welcomed irrespective of age, gender, social class or ethnicity. Jesus washed the feet of his disciples, living a servant leadership, welcoming the other and not seeking status. This formation of a hospitable community to which all are welcome may appear to be counter cultural to many but it is truly biblical. Such communities are also signs of hope that love is possible in this world, and that is my prayer for the communities here in the Mid-Loes Benefice, for all the churches and everyone associated with them, that we will continue to show, that we are churches of hospitality in all its true meaning.
