DR DAN POULTER MP

Member of Parliament for Central Suffolk and North Ipswich

Just recently the Government revealed its A, B,C, D approach for the health service, which lays out some unarguably important priorities for the NHS - Ambulances, Backlog, Care, Doctors & Dentists. However, the A, B, C, D approach also induces a weary roll of the eyes. As a doctor, I know that targets and league tables have consistently failed to positively change how health care is delivered or how patients experience care. If good healthcare was about targets, then the NHS would already be in great shape.

Over the past decade, our health service has received significant increases in funding. In Suffolk, we have seen a new heart unit at Ipswich Hospital and improvements to local maternity services. But if we really care about our NHS, and want to see a health and care service that continues to be the envy of the world, we must also recognise that hand in hand with additional funding must go reform. Far too often, politics gets in the way of the development of sensible healthcare policy and the NHS becomes a political football where the only losers are patients.

I am deeply concerned by the lack of meaningful debate about the future of the health system. At its creation, the NHS was visionary. Three quarters of a century later, facing unprecedented pressures, it is ill equipped to cope with the dramatically different health needs of today's population.

A health service largely built to provide episodic and acute care, is now heavily dominated by the treatment and management of chronic conditions and multi-morbidity. Healthcare is accounting for an ever growing share of public spending, yet on many indicators, the health of the population is deteriorating. Whilst, this is broadly true of all high income health systems, our hospital centric model is no longer fit for purpose.

Despite successive plans and strategies to shift focus and expenditure towards prevention and community based care, little real progress has

been made, with the recent creation of integrated care boards also doing little, if anything, to shift the dial. In fact, NHS spending on hospitals as a share of health spending has been increasing since 2015. An urgent rethink is needed.

A meaningful move to community based care is essential. It must be driven by proper integration of NHS with social care services, and be supported by a realistic workforce plan to ensure the right numbers of frontline healthcare professionals are trained and retained to deliver patient care.

The latest A,B,C,D approach, like many health policies before it, is a mere sticking plaster. It is now time for an honest conversation about how we improve the health of the nation and radically radical transform the delivery of health care for the benefit of patients.

DALLINGHOO NOTES

St Mary's, Dallinghoo – Our final Phase III has started

The final phase of our repair programme has started. The focus is on internal repairs and so having erected all the scaffolding the church is shut until they are completed – due to be by 28th October.

The main challenges are to:

- Remove all the flaking plaster, repair the cracks and then replaster
- Modify two of the windows in the north and south nave to enable secure ventilation
- Repair the areas of the floor where tiles have come loose
- Clean and inspect all the woodwork and walls
- Where needed, repair and treat the wood worm and death watch beetle infestations
- And finally, to redecorate

Al-Anon meetings are free. We accept donations from members towards running costs and buying literature so that we can be self-supporting. We give only what we can afford.

What we are not

Al-Anon is not a therapy group. We do not offer counselling or advice or try to explain your experiences.

We are not a religious organisation and welcome those of all faiths and none, treating everyone as equals. We discourage discussion about religion, politics and other outside topics.

How do I get help?

We want to make it as simple and easy as possible for you to get to a meeting where you will find others who have also had family members

or friends who are problem drinkers.

The best way to find out what Al-Anon is all about and how we can help you is to attend a meeting, where you will be warmly welcomed. You can also visit <u>https://www.al-anonuk.org.uk</u> where there is information you can read or download, including podcasts.

Because the World Cup Final takes place on the Sunday before Christmas it is necessary to change the arrangements for our Carol Service which will now take place on **Tuesday 20th December** at 7pm. OVERGROWN HEDGEROWS.

Thank you to all residents who have in recent weeks trimmed back or cut their roadside hedges. This maintenance is important in that overgrown hedges are a danger to pedestrians and motorists alike. The requirements [national standards] are that <u>all</u> hedges should be <u>at least</u> 50cm [20"] back from the edge of the highway to a minimum height of 3m [10'] so as to provide pedestrian refuge. Where this cannot be achieved and particularly where visibility is compromised the hedge should be maintained at a height no greater than 1.05m [42"]. If you are struggling to see approaching vehicles when exiting your driveway the chances are action is required! At the time of writing around eight premises require remedial works to be undertaken.

At the recent Parish Council Meeting it was resolved that Robert Grimsey will visit residences where hedgerows are in need of attention. Anyone with concerns about their hedges or perhaps in need of help to get them cut back is invited to contact Robert [robert@rwgrimsey.co.uk], he will advise and or help if he can.

As a last resort if all other options fail SCC Highways will serve 'hedge cutting notices' requiring the work to be undertaken within a given time-scale, hopefully that will not be necessary in Ashfield! RG.

ASHFIELD NOTES

BLOCKED DITCHES.

Whilst most ditches/watercourses are still dry at present it is important to remember that before long they will be providing vital surface water drainage. All properties with ditches within their curtilage are encouraged to ensure that all rubbish and obstructions are removed so that water can flow away properly. If anyone has concerns about a blocked ditch they are encouraged to contact the landowner concerned [if known] who has responsibility to ensure their watercourses function efficiently! As a last resort contact any member of the Parish Council so that concerns can be addressed.

FOOTPATHS.

At the present time it is believed that the footpaths within Ashfield-cum-Thorpe are in good order and without obstruction. We are aware of a few missing signs that will be replaced over the winter. Anyone using FP32 [shortcut from Grove Farm to Waddlegoose Lane] is asked to exercise caution whilst crossing the sleeper bridge where a sleeper has rotted. SCC are aware of this yet to date have not been able to provide us with a date when a repair will be undertaken. We will continue to press for this to be done as a matter of urgency. Should you encounter any problems out on the footpaths of Ashfield please let Malcolm Pease or Robert Grimsey know so that appropriate action can be taken. Thank you and enjoy your walks! AFG.
