For the children, there was a great amount of joy as they were looking forward to the summer holidays which was tinged with sadness as they considered leaving their school or moving up a year group leaving their teacher with whom they had built a strong relationship. The Falconer – Earl Soham Village Sign



The first "Falconer" was erected by Earl Soham Women's Institute to commemorate the H. M. The Queen's Coronation in 1953. It was carved by Ray Exworth, a student at the Ipswich Art School for a fee of £15. The Art Master, Bernard Reynolds was paid 2 guineas for arranging to have the work done. The cost of erecting the statue, including the cement pedestal was a further £15. (Earl Soham WI Archives).

The 'first' *Falconer* carved from whole oak in 1953, succumbed to rot at the base in the

1980s. A very arresting figure, placed on a pedestal on the Village Green, he could be seen from all directions and all angles. Solidly carved, he represented Earl Soham as a centre of falconry in past centuries and was much commented upon by visitors to the area.

The overall sculpture was rather rough in appearance even though treated at regular intervals with preservative. This carving is now to be found in Earl Soham Village Hall.

The second "Falconer" was unveiled in 1990. On the advice of Bernard Reynolds who had been unable to contact the original carver, the Women's Institute in January 1990 commissioned Nick Deans of Aldborough, Norfolk to carve a replica. In Bernard Reynolds' opinion (1988) "he is the only other sculptor I know who regularly carves figures and animals in whole logs".



Nick Deans' interpretation of the original *Falconer* has produced a very much slimmer, smoother and more finely carved sign, whilst still adhering to the original concept of the *Falconer*. The original sign was especially sited away from the main road to avoid possible


traffic damage. The site is in a slight dip, so the plinth is essential for the sign to be seen from all angles. The oak tree, planted in 1977 to mark the Queen's Silver Jubilee, enhances the original site.

Earl Soham WI have a fund known as the Falconer Fund, set aside for keeping our rather special village sign in good condition. It's been a while, and he must be overdue for a bit of a rub down and oiling with preservative. The WI are seeking someone with the expertise and time to do this. We have some funds available for expenses and payment for this.



LETHERINGHAM NOTES

Musica Antica Rotherhithe Concert at the Priory Church of St Mary's, Letheringham 16th July 2023

Musica Antica Rotherhithe brought to the Priory Church of St Mary, their beautiful programme of early music "Rittrati" in which they performed songs and cantatas by three of the most prolific female composers of the 17th Century: Barbara Strozzi, Antonia Bembo and Isabella Leonarda.

Oliver Doyle, in his introduction, asked a full house, how many in the audience had heard of any of the three female composers and only a handful of people put up their hands, by the interval however, people were raving about the quality of the musicians and the beauty of the works being performed.

Many were intrigued by the baroque instruments being played, in particular the Theorbo and and the Viola di Gamba and during the interval both Sarah Small and Peter Martin were able to answer the many questions they were being asked about their instruments. Alan Gotto the harpsichord maker was also on hand to answer questions about the harpsichord that was played by Oliver Doyle. Tristram Cooke was also able to explain his role as a professional singer and the part he played in both the late Queen Elizabeth's funeral and Coronation of King Charles III, as one of only four full time (counter tenor) choristers in Westminster Abbey.

At the end of the concert we were inundated by people enthused by the music they had just heard with comments such as "this a was a real jewel" and "I came but was not expecting something so utterly beautiful."

The quality and professionalism of the musicians from the strings to the singers combined to make this a unique and magical evening from which the LPCC raised £1150 for the church restoration fund.

ASHFIELD NOTES

ROADSIDE HEDGES

Now that the bird nesting season is past please can I remind residents of the need to maintain roadside hedges. There is a requirement that all roadside hedges should be maintained so as to be 50cm back from the edge of the highway and where this cannot be achieved or visibility for vehicles accessing/egressing premises the height of the hedge should be reduced to and kept no more than 105cm [42"] tall. Whilst where there is a concrete kerb this distance is obvious elsewhere it is necessary to find the edge of the tarmac surface and measure back from there bearing in mind that soil/grass may have grown out too.

The purpose of this is to provide 'pedestrian refuge' so that people can get off the road if required for passing traffic as well ensuring the visibility when using private driveways so you can see approaching traffic.

After I raised this in the magazine last year I am pleased to report that most residents reacted very positively, thank you for that! I am already working with one resident who has a very overgrown hedge and expect that to be cleared quite soon. I would ask any resident with a hedge that is currently overgrown to put in place remedial action as soon as possible please. If any of this is unclear or assistance is required please do not hesitate to contact me. I will review the situation at the beginning of September when personal visits may take place, exceptionally Suffolk County Council can issue 'hedge cutting notices' I hope that will not be necessary in Ashfield. Thank you.

ASHFIELD CHURCH—170 YEARS OLD

On the 30th of August 1853 the foundation stone of the present church building in Ashfield was laid by Lord Henniker [4th Baron Henniker of Stratford-upon-Slaney] whose family at that time

owned something 30,000 acres [roughly speaking 15 parishes] of land locally and whose seat was and is to this day at Thornham near Eye. Lord Henniker also built the village school now appropriately named 'Henniker House' where a stone showing the family crest

can be seen.. The total cost of the building is recorded as being circa £2000. A previous [12th century?] church building on the site had fallen into ruins in the late 1700s and records show that

previous to that a church was recorded on the site in the Doomsday Book [1086]. There is little doubt that the site where St Mary's now stands is by far the longest occupied land in Ashfield!

We will be celebrating this with a special service on Sunday 3rd September of which more details can be found elsewhere in the mag. We hope very much that you will be able to join us for this and/or refreshments



in the village hall after the service. Full details will be circulated on the village email nearer the time.
