

Neville William Skeet

Sadly, Neville died at home on 12th March aged 79. Neville's health had deteriorated over the last two years but with the devoted help of Margaret and carers he had been able to stay at home, at Marke Cottage, with Margaret.

Neville began his life with his parents, William and Peggy, in Otley where William set up a haulage business. Neville started school at Otley, then moved on to Ipswich School. Neville excelled at running while at Ipswich School and became a cross country champion.

When Neville left school he went straight to work for his father in the haulage business. He said he never considered doing anything else, he gained his HGV license, learned how to build and repair engines and how to run the business. Neville organized the movement of many abnormal loads – which was the speciality of W T Skeet Haulage. The company moved the highest and widest load to be moved in Suffolk, this was the "mustard pot" from Mendlesham to Needham Market, where it still stands today, and is now a working vet's practice.

Neville and Margaret married in 1965 and moved to Ipswich where they became proud parents to James and Nicola.

Neville also had a passion for rallying which he started in the early seventies with a Mini Cooper, he was a competitive driver and moved onto a Cosworth powered Ford Escort, which he entered into the Lombard RAC Rally for two years running. He had his share of spills, but was always back at work on Monday morning, whatever his injuries.

Neville retired from rallying in the early 80's, which gave him and Margaret and the family the opportunity to fulfil his travel dreams. The family moved to Marke Cottage in Monewden in 1988, and quickly fitted into village life in the community, which often involved social functions. Neville would always be the first to

volunteer for the washing up, and could always be seen at the sink! In 1995 Neville became a proud Grandpa for the first time to Lauren, followed by Kristin, Yasmine and Leon. They all loved him dearly and have many memories of happy times spent with him. We all remember Neville as Mr Reliable and Dependable, quietly going about whatever needed doing, he would never let you down if he had to agreed to do something, whether it be cutting the church hedge, cutting grass or with the church Spring clean and all the other jobs which fall upon the churchwarden, which is a post he held for twelve years.

Neville was a good friend and a much loved member of this community and is greatly missed by us all. Brian Martin



As many of our children and grandchildren enter the summer exam term, it provides an opportunity to reflect upon what skills and qualifications are now needed for young people entering the world of work.

The Prime Minister recently announced that in future, all children will need to study maths until age 18. Although compulsory maths until the age of 18 does not, initially, feel very attractive, I believe we can change perceptions of the subject. Applying maths skills in the real world is essential in all jobs and walks of life and offers an increase in self-confidence that will serve our children well throughout their lives.

As a regular visitor to schools across our area, I am proud of the hard work that goes into supporting our children. During a recent visit to Kesgrave High School, I was asked some excellent questions by a student around encouraging young women to take up Science, Tech, Engineering and Maths (STEM) qualifications and retaining that talent for lifelong careers in Suffolk.

It has become clear to me that our young people care deeply about achieving net zero, and I am pleased that along with sixth forms, we have a wide range of educational settings here that offer these qualifications, such as Suffolk New and Suffolk Rural. Our schools and colleges have strong relationships with local businesses and are already seeking opportunities for our young people with Sizewell C.

Suffolk's Energy Coast is internationally recognised as excellent in producing and delivering sustainable, clean energy solutions, offering great careers and underpinning economic growth here in

Suffolk and across the UK. We have one of the driest climates in England with longer hours of daily sunshine and miles of coastline, so it is seen as the perfect location for solar energy and of course, offshore wind.

I have reservations about the proposals for Sizewell C, but until we can find better ways of storing the electricity produced by renewable sources, nuclear power remains an important form of electricity production. We are all striving to be more environmentally conscious and nuclear energy has the advantage of being carbon neutral and so reduces reliance on fossil fuels. Maths underpins achievement in all STEM subjects which are key to supporting the growth in jobs in Suffolk's energy industry. Thanks to Suffolk's leading role in the nuclear and renewables sector, our young people can play their part in building a brighter, greener future, but let's not forget that maths is useful in all walks of life. Young people will one day need to manage household budgets, understand mobile phone contracts and arrange mortgages. These skills are workplace transferable, and we must not fail our children when it comes to confidence in maths both for their own lives and in safeguarding a strong economic future for the country.

I am incredibly proud of everything we have to offer young people, here in Suffolk. I couldn't think of a better place to live and work, and I wish all our students all the very best for their exams and hopefully some outstanding results to come.

Eric was a great support to Perry during the many years she served as churchwarden in unison with Margaret (Doe), doing many maintenance and DIY jobs at the church. Trevor recalls the occasion when his father, Eric's older brother by some years, called in on his way to Hoo church, announcing that he and Eric were going to clear the church gutters that afternoon. In response to a somewhat alarmed question as to why he was undertaking that sort of work at his age, Trevor's father replied that he would be holding the ladder while Eric went up it! After all, Eric was the youngster, albeit he was in his seventies at the time! On a personal note, I feel very privileged to have known Eric for the last dozen or so years of his life. I have such happy memories of times spent

in his and Perry's company, invariably in the kitchen at Elmtree Farm, Hoo. I was always made so welcome, and if I was a nuisance turning up unannounced while on one of my bike rides, Perry and Eric never let on, quite the reverse in fact. I would be given a large piece of one of Perry's delicious cakes, while Eric would sit in the corner and chat about countryside matters and life in Hoo and the surrounding villages as it used to be. When I left, without fail, Eric would thank me for calling by, and he did so the last time I saw him, at Woodbridge Lodge in February.

I introduced Perry and Eric to my late brother in law, who was also a farming man all his life. Eric and Eddie were very similar in age (they were born a couple of weeks apart, in 1932) and in character, quiet, unassuming and wonderful people. The two of them became good friends and I loved to hear them talk about rural life. Eric would begin the conversation with a question: "Do you remember", "Did you know" or "Did you ever" and they were away. One of Eddie's proudest moments was when he took over from Eric on David Doe's tractor at the Bucklesham Tractor Rally and ploughed his first furrow on Suffolk soil at the age of 81. I can still picture Eric on that day, on the tractor, cap on his head and a broad smile on his face when we greeted him.

Someone who was very fond of Eric told me once that he was like the grandfather she never had. That sums up Eric very well; a kind, modest man about whom people only had good things to say. Thank you, Eric, for your friendship and for all you did for the parish of Hoo over so many years.
