From The Rectory...

Well, here we are again. Summer seems to have come and gone... with very little sunshine, so now our attention turns to Harvest, to Advent and, dare I say it... to Christmas!

But, we are where we are and already the diary is becoming full of preparation meetings for various services and events taking place over the coming months.

By the time you receive this magazine, Harvest Services would have already taken place within the benefice, with others planned over the coming weeks. This year, the benefice will be donating all appropriate food donations to FIND (Families in Need), an Ipswich-based charity, providing vital support resources in Ipswich and the surrounding towns and villages. We may know FIND as a local Foodbank, but it is so much more. On talking to the founder of the charity, Maureen Reynel MBE, it was interesting to hear of the range of support provided to many people in need. Whether homeless, working people struggling to survive due to the cost of living crisis; people who have depression or other mential health issues; and a range of other issues that could affect any one of us. FIND also works with local agencies including schools, doctors, health visitors, social workers and CAB, to name a few.

I am delighted that the churches of The Benefice of Mid-Loes will be supporting FIND through donation boxes that will be available at each church, clearly identified and available to drop off any donations that you feel able to give. The donations will then be collected on a regular basis and taken to the central distribution hub for FIND. The donation boxes will appear during October at every church. There is more information on page 30, but I would encourage you to look at the FIND website, www.findipswich.org.uk.

A wonderful benefice service took place at Ashfield on 3rd September, where we celebrated 170 years since the foundation stone was laid for the current church, as well as launching the benefice 5-year Plan for Growth, along with presenting a cheque to EACH, with a £600 cheque being given to the charity through your generosity at the Vicar's Tea Party, which took place in July. Further details on the Plan for Growth can be found on pages 26 and 27, and I must thank you all for the contributions made through completing questionnaires, visiting Listening Events, etc.

I feel a real sense of energy within the benefice, not just through the churches, but also through the community events that are taking place over the coming months. I am reminded of the importance of 'loving thy neighbour' and everything talked about here and the actions that are taking place throughout the benefice, show this to be so true. I don't know about you, but I feed off the energy of others and right now, I am very much looking forward to all aspects of ministry and community engagement during the coming months.





VACANCY: Following the departure of David Egan the Parish Council is seeking a new Councillor to represent Cretingham. The PC meets 4 times a year with the possibility of additional, short meetings - usually about planning matters. We meet on Tuesdays at 7.30pm in Monewden Village Hall. If you are interested in undertaking this role please contact me for further information.

PC MEETINGS IN 2024: Please be advised of the following dates for 2024. 16th January; 12th March; 12th May and 17th September. Agendas, minutes, etc can be found on our website: http://cretinghammonewdenhoo.onesuffolk.net/

FOOTPATH MAINTENANCE: This topic was discussed at our September meeting following questions raised by concerned villagers. Specifically - who is responsible for cutting the footpaths that criss-cross our parishes? And who is responsible for keeping the hedges/trees alongside them in good order? The County Council is responsible for keeping the footpaths trimmed - although this task is sometimes undertaken on a goodwill basis by the landowner - THANK YOU to those who do this. County Council policy is to cut twice a year but a severely restricted budget means these cuts are prioritised (and I quote) "...to those paths that people genuinely want or need to use." The limited budget can also mean that "... we are not in a position to cut all routes, or those routes that we do cut as often as we would like to." The ongoing maintenance of hedges and trees alongside public rights of way (footpaths, bridleways and byways - which total nearly 18 miles in our 3 parishes, 3,500 miles across Suffolk) is the responsibility of the owner of the land on which they are planted. If you use specific footpaths regularly and they become overgrown or the hedges are encroaching, then please let one of your Parish Councillors know. Alternatively you can contact the Rights of Way & Access Team by email on prow.east@suffolk.gov.uk



Landguard Fort, Felixstowe - through the ages.

Many thanks to Gerry Dunlavey, who has been a guide at Landguard Fort for many years, for enlightening us with his knowledge of the Fort's history dating back to Henry VIII's reign. He related the dramatic stories of how the fortifications played a pivotal role in the defence of the East Coast for over 400 years, where the last opposed seaborne invasion of England by the Dutch in1667 and the first land battle of the Royal Marines happened and much much more.


Plan for Growth 2023-2028

At the Benefice Service on 3rd September, the 'Growing in God - Plan for Growth' was launched, providing the benefice with a five-year plan for ministry across the 8-church benefice.

At the service, Revd Gary shared a little about the background, the discernment and the outcomes from a range of information gathering that has taken place over the past 10 months through questionnaires, conversations and information gathered at the Listening Events held earlier this year, the Ministry Team has been able to reach a conclusion in the shape of ministry for the next five years within the Benefice of Mid-Loes.

The Conclusion

It was agreed within the Ministry Team that the focus would be on:



Behind each of the headings, we have concluded that our ministry would focus on:

- ◆ DEPTH Bible Study and Prayer
- **♦ INFLUENCE Pastoral Support**
- YOUNGER Children and Families

DEPTH - Bible Study and Prayer

Establishing regular bible study opportunities across the benefice, perhaps including sermon series focussing on specific topics or books from the Bible.

Providing prayer resources for visitors to our churches, whilst also including more people to lead intercessions at services.

Developing our services to provide reflective opportunities through our worship, i.e. Taizé services and experience days/services for schools and families.

Services to bridge gaps with our communities. Celebrating life events and people.

INFLUENCE - Pastoral Support

Utilising the church buildings for coffee mornings and other similar opportunities in supporting our communities.

Ongoing review of home visiting and home Communion.

Keeping people informed through the provision of a monthly news sheet, focussing on ministry and updates within our churches.

YOUNGER – Children and Families

Set up a monthly youth/family club, encouraging all ages to come together outside of the traditional Sunday morning.

Build on links with the two schools within the benefice, through Collective Worship and developing an after-school club.

Develop music through our choir and schools, providing singing events for young people.

Harvest Services across the Benefice

This year, and going forward, the benefice churches are delighted to be supporting FIND (Families in Need) a local charity based in Ipswich supporting people across the local villages and towns.

For over 30 years, Families in Need (FIND) Ipswich, has offered a lifeline to people in Ipswich and the surrounding areas who are experiencing poverty and despair.

FIND provides free food parcels and personal care items to help people get through a crisis, as well as furniture, bedding and other household items where the person or family has none.

An army of over 80 volunteers regularly give their time freely to check and sort the donated food, collect items from local stores, make up the food parcels and deliver them.

It's a six-day a week operation.

The demand for food parcels has risen year on year and FIND now distributes an average of 120-150 parcels every week and even more at Christmas - more than 7,000 every year.

Going Forward

During October, each church within the benefice will become a donation point where there will be boxes in the church porches where donations can be left. The donations will then be collected on a regular basis and taken to the offices of FIND. Currently, the food requirements are as follows:

Long grain rice - Long-life whole milk
Toiletries for men, women and children
Tinned vegetables, meat, fruit/desserts
Coffee - Sugar - Jam - Soup
Pet food (dog, cat, fish, rabbit/guinea pig)

Like many of you I feel blessed to live in Suffolk. I always do my best to support local businesses, especially our farmers and food producers. Most of you are aware, that as well as being your MP, I am a doctor working in the NHS and, not long ago, I wrote about the perils of faddy and extreme diets. Buying locally produced fresh, seasonal food is absolutely vital for our health and it is also far better for our environment if we buy local and keep our food miles down wherever possible.

I often visit our local farmers and farm shops, and I am always impressed by the high quality of local produce, by our high animal welfare standards and by the high standards of traceability from farm to fork of Suffolk produced food and drink. However, many of us lead busy lives, and it is often necessary to do our shopping online as we keep up with the demands of juggling work and family. There are also many people who struggle with mobility issues and other health concerns who find online shopping an essential lifeline.

I am sure that most people, whatever their shopping habits, always hope to find ways to support local producers where they can. That is why I have called on all of the big supermarkets to adopt a simple new system to make it much easier for online shoppers to buy British.

At the end of August, I helped to co-ordinate a letter from over 100 MPs that went out to the big supermarket companies urging them to support a Buy British Campaign. We are asking supermarkets

to highlight the very best of British produce by incorporating a 'Buy British' section on their online shopping pages. The simple addition of a tab that collates produce from farmers across the UK will help customers shop locally quickly and easily, with the click of a mouse.

Many of our shops and supermarkets already label British made and farmed products, The addition of a 'Buy British' button is simply providing the online shopper with the same ability to better identify homegrown produce as is already enjoyed by those attending a shop in person. A 'Buy British' button could encourage customers to eat seasonally and healthily and support their local farmers at the same time.

I have long championed the work of Suffolk's farmers in improving our food security, supporting a strong local economy and preserving and protecting the environment. I know the people of Suffolk want to back our local farmers and food producers. We all want to understand more about where our food comes from and how it is produced. This simple change on supermarket webpages will help to ensure home grown food is easily identifiable and that in the future we can all play our part in backing British farmers and food producers.

I'm pleased to have played a key role in co-ordinating this important initiative. I talk to farmers in Suffolk regularly, and they tell me time and again the best way we can support them is to simply, 'buy British'. Ensuring we do this is a win-win situation, we protect our health, Suffolk's economy and our environment.
