From The Rectory ...

What a mix of emotions I have experienced during the past few weeks. A combination of baptisms, weddings, and funerals, each bringing a range of emotion to both myself and all those involved. From the sadness of saying goodbye to loved ones, to the joy of welcoming a young person into our church family, and the joy of two people coming together in marriage... with one common denominator involved across the services...LOVE.

I have talked about love before, for which I make no apologies, as I believe we all need reminding of the importance of love within ourselves, within our relationships, and within our communities, and not just during the life services that we attend where we are reminded of the love of a church family through baptism; the love of two people as they get married; or the love of someone who has recently died.

The word love can often just be a throwaway word, perhaps said because you want to please someone...'love you too'...'l love chocolate'...or, as I have experienced recently, a genuine, heartfelt love, the love that could be described as agape, a Christian love that is the kind of love and action that shows empathy; extends the desire for good of the beloved; wants the best; extends help or demonstrates good intentions; and is intended for everyone. Agape love is sacrificial.

Agape is not the saccharine-filled, Hollywood love that we see through films and TV shows, it is much more, much deeper, and that is what I have experienced across all the life services I have recently been involved with.

Agape love is unconcerned with the self and concerned with the greatest good of another. Agape isn't born just out of emotions, feelings, familiarity, or attraction, but from the will and as a choice. Agape requires faithfulness, commitment, and sacrifice without expecting anything in return.

The Apostle Paul arguably presents the best case for love, when he writes to the people of Corinth, where the church was in complete disarray and on the verge of imploding upon itself. The church was rife with public immorality, doctrinal confusion, party politics, petty bickering, divisions. And as to the root cause all of those problems, Paul subscribes to one deficiency... the Corinthians were not manifesting and exercising sacrificial love to each other in their common life.

Paul writes, 'love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It is not rude, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no records of wrongs. Love does not delight in evil, but rejoices with the truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres. Love never fails'.

And it is this agape, this love, that Paul begins his appeal to the Corinthians and perhaps something for society today to listen to as we constantly witness disarray and lack of trust in modern politics; as we witness a 'cancel culture' where we can no longer agree to disagree; as we listen to constant arguing over issues of sexuality and diversity. Paul's point is a simple one... love is the premier virtue of the Christian life, in fact it should be the premier virtue of society today. It towers above all others in importance, and it must be the ground, the foundation, the first principle of everything we do and are, and it is down to us to do what we can to manifest this love within our church, within our lives, and within our communities.

Love, love, love... love is all we need.

CHARSFIELD PRIMARY SCHOOL

All the pupils and staff at Charsfield Primary School have been very busy; here are just a few of the things that we have got up this term!

Rowan Class have embraced the joys of gardening. We have planted a variety of fruits and vegetables and watched them grow. The children learned about the life cycles of plants, the importance of sunlight and water, and the satisfaction of harvesting their own produce. To celebrate our gardening efforts, we used our freshly grown lettuce to make delicious cheese and lettuce sandwiches which supported us in learning our fractions. We focused on dividing our sandwiches into halves and quarters before eating them which the children thoroughly enjoyed. Our geography and history topics this term were "Magnificent Monarchs and Royal Residences." We delved into the fascinating world of royalty, exploring the lives and reigns of



various monarchs and their homes. A highlight of this topic was our trip to Orford Castle. The children were thrilled to explore the historic site, learning about its construction, purpose, and the historical figures associated with it.

Pupils in Ash Class based their literacy upon 'The owl who was afraid of the dark'. The children have had lots of opportunities to write descriptively, using dialogue and other literary devices. We were very fortunate to be able to go to the Suffolk Owl sanctuary at Stonham barns. Our tour guide took us to see many different species of owls, vultures and eagles, some of which are extremely rare. Our favourite owl was the Milky White Owl, which performed a little dance for us!

In Oak Class pupils have written their own poems based upon Kit Wright's poem: The Magic Box. They really enjoyed writing these and took great care over the presentation of their work. This is now displayed in school for visitors to see in September.

Pupils in Key Stage 2 performed The Pirates of the Curry Bean to two jammed-packed audiences of parents and relatives earlier in July. The children did a wonderful job of making everyone laugh at their hilarious jokes and entertained with their singing. The older pupils were also given the responsibility of being the backstage crew – in charge of sound effects, music and props. They did a good job of making sure everything was where it should be in order to make the performances run smoothly.

In Forest School lessons pupils have been learning to assess their own risks when exploring and playing. The spider web of ropes were great fun to see how far they could push their abilities, to climb and balance and how to cope when it didn't go quite as planned. Most importantly the resilience to get back up and try again. They have also been working on crafting skills making clay creatures, spotter books and name bunting and practising fire lighting skills. We look forward to more Forest School sessions next year.



We have taken part in lots of sporting events this term: we started with Reception and KS1 going to Framlingham College to participate in a multi skills carousel with a tennis theme. This was a wonderful day with lots of different activities from throwing and catching and balancing a tennis ball on a racket to working in a group to gain points. Next, we were all geared up for Cricket at Mellis Cricket club, however, the summer weather got the better of the pitch and the event was cancelled due to a water-logged pitch. We look forward to this event next year. Our next event was Quadkids for Reception and KS1 at Thomas Mills. Once again, the children had a fantastic day experiencing lots of different athletic events. The next event for KS2 was rounders at Hartismere. The children played 5 games and improved with each game. They all had a fantastic time, and all worked well as a team. Our final events for the year were Footgolf and Just Dance at Hartismere. This is the biggest group of children taken at one time and they were all fantastic. All children were engaged with their event and had a great afternoon.

In September we looking forward to running a Parent and Toddler group on a Wednesday afternoon – more details will follow on our social media. We also look forward to opening our nursery for children aged 3+ too. If you would like to find out more about our school, please look at our Facebook and Instagram pages. JEAN CLARKE

1928-2024

Jean Clarke died on May 1st 2024 on the seventieth anniversary of Letheringham becoming her home when she married Kenneth on May 1st 1954. She was 95 and 'well past my sell by date' as she frequently said. That summed up her straightforward approach to life – down to earth, practical and independent - always keen to play her part – to be useful and get things done – preferably her way!

Jean played a key role in village life throughout most of her seventy years here. In 1957 she took on the annual door to door poppy collection in Letheringham. For the next fifty plus years, come October, her collecting tin and tray of poppies would be in her car wherever she went until she knew she had given every householder an opportunity to buy – from her! It was a matter of great pride and competitive achievement for her to maximise what she collected. She only once made the mistake of accepting the offer of a glass of Sally Peck's home-made parsnip wine while on her rounds!

Jean served on Easton & Letheringham Parish Council and instigated the establishment in 1992 of a separate parish council for Letheringham which she chaired for many years.

A long-term supporter of Letheringham Church and member of the PCC, Jean was also a Church Warden for several years. She organised a couple of flower festivals and various light-hearted concerts and was always at the heart of any catering that was required. She instigated mulled wine and mince pies after the annual carol service and had a regular slot on the flower and cleaning rota for decades. From the early days of the SHCT annual bike ride, Jean was Letheringham's co-ordinator, always striving to offer a good selection of biscuits and squash to reward those who made the effort to visit.

In recent years her declining strength and abilities curtailed her capacity to play an active role and that frustrated her greatly but she remained grateful for the opportunities and friendships she had had throughout her life and her good fortune.

Food Donations across the Benefice

The benefice churches are delighted to be supporting FIND (Families in Need) a local charity based in Ipswich supporting people across the local villages and towns.

For over 30 years, Families in Need (FIND) Ipswich, has offered a lifeline to people in Ipswich and the surrounding areas who are experiencing poverty and despair.

FIND provides free food parcels and personal care items to help people get through a crisis, as well as furniture, bedding and other household items where the person or family has none.

An army of over 80 volunteers regularly give their time freely to check and sort the donated food, collect items from local stores, make up the food parcels and deliver them.

It's a six-day a week operation.

The demand for food parcels has risen year on year and FIND now distributes an average of 120-150 parcels every week and even more at Christmas - more than 7,000 every year.

Going Forward

Each church within the benefice has now become a donation point where there are boxes in the church porches in which donations can be left. The donations will then be collected on a regular basis and taken to the offices of FIND. Currently, the food requirements are as follows:

> Long grain rice - Long-life whole milk Toiletries for men, women and children Tinned vegetables, meat, fruit/desserts Coffee - Sugar - Jam - Soup Pet food (dog, cat, fish, rabbit/guinea pig)
