

From The Rectory...

s we move into April, and with the joyful celebration of Easter looming in the distance, the church also turns its attention to the 'business end' of church life, dealing with the Annual Parochial Church Meeting; elections for church officers; generating the Electoral Roll; presenting the Annual



Accounts; and reporting on the previous year's activities within the church; so I thought it might be worth reminding ourselves what all this means with a brief overview of the importance of each of these areas of church administration.

Parochial Church Council (PCC)

The governing body of the church is known as the PCC, and is a charitable trust, with members automatically becoming charitable trustees. Members are elected at the Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM). The PCC consists of Churchwarden/s; a Treasurer; a Secretary; along with elected members who all play a vital role in the running of your church. The elected trustees manage the church's finances, maintenance of the church, churchyard and associated buildings, whilst also supporting me, as the Rector, working together to advance the church's mission and outreach.

Flectoral Roll

The Electoral Roll is a register of the lay members of the church who are then entitled to vote at the APCM, as well as being eligible to be elected on to their PCC. Whilst the Electoral Roll must be revised annually, a new roll is to be prepared (every sixth year starting from this year, 2025). Forms will be available through your church, so please consider registering and being able to have your say on the future of your local parish church.

Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM)

The APCM is a statutory meeting held in every parish in the Church of England, typically between January 1st and May 31st, where reports on parish activities, finances, and the electoral roll are presented, along with elections for the Parochial Church Council (PCC) taking place. The APCM is a crucial event in the church calendar where the church community gathers to review the past year's activities and to vote (if eligible) for the election of the various officers of the church.

There is so much more that could be discussed here regarding other important areas of church life, but these can be saved for another occasion. For now, my reason for sharing this overview with you is to encourage you to consider being on the Electoral Roll, and to consider what gifts and talents you might have to become a trustee of your local church, by seeking to be elected onto the PCC.

I am incredibly grateful of the work our 8 PCCs undertake in order to keep their respective churches open and alive for our local communities and for the many visitors who visit our churches, but there is always room for more people to play an important role in the day-to-day running of our churches, so if you wish to have an informal conversation about playing a role in your local church, please give me a call.

Forms to register will be available in the porch of St. Peter's from 27th March 2025 and must be returned to Bev Gugenheim (The Cottage, The Street, Charsfield) or Linda Stratton (Middle Cottage, Davey Lane, Charsfield) by 27th April 2025.

WORLD DAY OF PRAYER

The World Day of Prayer is a global ecumenical movement of informed prayer and prayerful action. The service that we held on March 7th at St. Peter's was part of a circle of prayer that took place that day, around the world.

The service took us to the Cook Islands, where we heard about the life of three women from

the islands and learnt a little about the struggle of the Cook Islanders to keep alive their native Maori language and traditions.

We placed blue fabric on the altar to represent the ocean with a large bowl of water and banana leaves and tropical flowers to evoke the tropical ambience of the pacific Cook Islands.

Next year's World Day of Prayer will be on Friday 6th March and the service will be produced by women in Nigeria with the theme: "I will give you rest, come."

Some facts you may not know about St Peter's Church, Charsfield

We have recently revised the short Guide to the church, including a large print laminated version. St Peter's is a rather special building and here are a few facts which may be new to you:

- It is a Grade 1 listed building (see www.historicengland.org.uk)
- Charsfield's village cenotaph is on the North wall inside the church, listing the fallen of the two World Wars (you may recognise village names); we remember them especially at our Remembrance Services;
- The flushwork frieze along the base of the Tower is unusual and includes a panel with the chalice and wafer on the West side;
- The much admired church clock was a gift in 1930 from Miss Alice Whicker who lived in Brook House, Charsfield;
- The bells are no longer rung and the damaged Treble Bell is in the Porch. It was cast by James Edbere of Bury;
- The bench ends of the front pews were carved by a Mr Lanman of Framlingham and include a man in the stocks and a pelican.

Do pop into the church and pick up a Guide to enjoy all that is there. If you visit in the next week or two, look particularly and enjoy the primroses which look so beautiful at the East end of the churchyard.





The Parochial Church Council (PCC) is the governing body of a church, overseeing the church resources, assets, and buildings, with responsibility for ensuring compliance with policies such as health and safety, and safeguarding. The PCC is required to hold an APCM at which reports are shared, accounts approved, new members and officers are elected and questions may be asked about any area of the church's ministry.
