From The Rectory...

The past few months have been a particularly challenging time for myself and my family, which has caused a great deal of distress for many, including the wider family and close friends, a time of real hurt and pain, a time that sadly took its toll on myself resulting in some time off 'front-line ministry', for which I am indebted to the Ministry Team and many across the benefice in ensuring that it has been 'business as usual' across the benefice churches and communities.

I have used this time as a time of reflection, of prayer, and of healing. A time that has allowed me to STOP; to be there for my family; and to adjust aspects of my life that I had neglected because I had allowed busyness to take over from an established rhythm of life that existed before, a rhythm that I enjoyed as it brought routine and structure, which have always been an important aspect of my life, but areas of my life that I had neglected. I have spent much time reading and praying and have found real inspiration through the books of the Old Testament, particularly through the Psalms and Isaiah. I came across one reflection based on Isaiah 41:10 that inspired me, and a reflection that I have used as a prayer, gently reminding me that through the darkest times, I am not alone. Through my faith, there is **HOPE**; there is **PEACE**; and there is **LOVE**.

I share it with you because it could be a reflection or a prayer for each one of us to use, especially during the darker times that might descend upon us.

Do not be afraid, I am with you right now, right here in this very moment. Even in the silence, even in the heartbreak, even in the waiting, you are never alone.

I see the tears you have cried when no one was watching, I see the strength it took for you to keep going, and I want you to know that I am proud of you.

Don't be discouraged. I will strengthen you when your strength is gone, I will help you when you hope feels like it's fading. I will uphold you with my righteous right hand... not just to keep you standing, but to lift you higher.

You are not forgotten, you are not invisible, you are mine.

When the world feels too heavy and your heart too broken, lean on me, let my love heal the wounds you have hidden, let my presence carry you when you can't take another step.

I am the one who holds you when life feels too much, the one who walks beside you in every valley, and the one who will never leave your side... not for a second.

So, wipe your tears, take a deep breath, you will make it through this. Not because you are strong, but because I am.

Amen.

Whatever situation we might find ourselves in life, good times and bad, never underestimate the power of prayer. I think it is fair to say that most of our prayers are asking for something, for light to be found through dark times; for healing of a friend or loved one; but never forget to also pray to give thanks for all that we have. For most of us, we are blessed with the good lives that we have and for that, we give thanks.

Your benefice churches all offer Prayer Boxes for your prayers to be added which will be shared with those worshipping on a Sunday, allowing the community to pray for you or with you. We also have a dedicated email address for prayers to be submitted, midloesprayer@gmail.com, as well as a Prayer Team who pray daily for those who have requested prayers.

For me personally, I pray daily for the communities in which I serve; that each person may know that they are never alone; that each person is important; that each person may know that they are loved.

CHURCHYARD - BEECH TREE

Some of you may be aware that there is a large beech tree in Ashfield Churchyard planted to mark the occasion of the Silver Jubilee of King George V in 1935. In recent years this tree has started to shed branches [an indication of stress] probably due to wet/dry seasons we have been having. A further quite large bough fell during the passing of Storm Floris recently leaving the tree somewhat unbalanced. After taking advice from an independent tree surgeon and in the interests of public



safety we have reluctantly taken the decision to have the tree removed before it causes any damage to the church or neighbouring property.

We are expecting this work to be undertaken during September. It will involve the deployment of a cherry picker or similar at considerable expense as it isn't safe to climb the tree. It will be bought down in small sections, the timber and associated chippings will be left in the churchyard for the time being.

NEWS FROM CHARSFIELD PRIMARY SCHOOL

Pupils in our younger class took an exciting school trip to Southwold Lighthouse. We discovered all about how the lighthouse works and why it is so important for keeping ships safe at sea. After our visit, we enjoyed a tasty treat of chips on the beach — a perfect way to end our day.

amazing, and the children came up with lots of different ideas of what to do with their clothing. There are some budding designers in our school!

On Friday 18th July, we held our annual camp at school for the KS2 children. Unfortunately, with the weather deciding this would be the weekend it was going to turn stormy, we decided to have our camp in the school hall - rain was not going to stop play. After setting up our beds in the hall, we proceeded to have a water fight, a nice relief after a sticky day. Whilst the children dried off and chilled out, the BBQ got under way, followed by some more chill time and 'smores' around the fire pit. As the night drew in a bit of nighttime hide and seek commenced, followed by hot chocolate, getting ready for bed, watching a film and finally sleep - yes some sleep was had! The camp rounded off with tidying up the bedding and packing ready for home, followed by breakfast - bacon rolls, toast etc. A good time was had by all and for those children who have never had a night away from home, you should be very proud of yourselves.

Our KS 2 pupils put on a performance of Shakespeare Rocks at the beginning of July and they did a brilliant job of singing and acting. Some of the audience members couldn't believe that some of the children were only in year 3!

CHARSFIELD PARISH COUNCIL MEETING RE DEBEN SOLAR FARM AT LETHERINGHAM

Planning application made, public response by 5 September 2025

A parish council meeting took place on Monday 11 August, well attended by 30 residents and members of the public. Large print plans were inspected followed by a wide ranging debate. The near unanimous public show of hands subsequently led to a Parish Council vote to object to the planning application. A formal response demonstrating the application's contravention of the East Suffolk Council's own Local Plan is being created by the parish council for submission to ESC shortly.

The industrial level scale of this application over a 40yr term is of immense concern to people across a very wide area. This concern is further enhanced by other ground based solar projects already mooted and also local to us all. Beautiful rural Suffolk views we take for granted will be destroyed for a generation. In Letheringham this application is for an estimated 125,000 - 145,000 panels mounted up to 3m high on around 200 acres of quality agricultural land on two sites each surrounded by 2.48m metal deer/security fencing. Access for many 100s of HGVs plus other vehicles over the 12m construction in 2029 will be via the communities and schools of Easton, Letheringham and Charsfield all of which have narrow single track lanes.
